WHAT IS THE "ADOPT-A-PLAYER" INITIATIVE?

The **"Adopt-A-Player"** initiative was founded within the Little Tigers 7s Academy which started at Bridge House School in 2018, established by former international 7s player Marithy Pienaar and Caylix Sport Management.

Inspired by the success story of Brendan September we started the **"Adopt-A-Player"** initiative with the aim to use 7s as a vehicle to support players to reach their full potential. The players will be identified through a talent ID & assessment process and then be invited to join the academy from February to November annually. 66

The academy program runs for ten months (two training sessions per week) with scheduled fixtures & competitions as well as camps & clinics to develop and grow each individual player and as an academy. We identify the players at a young age where we can still add value at various levels and will focus on 7s related skills development and life skills within our mentorship program.

WHY THIS INITIATIVE?

The "Adopt-A-Player" initiative focuses on under-resourced community schools and is therefore dependant on sponsors who are willing to get involved and make a difference. The purpose of the initiative is to offer talented children, who cannot afford academy training, an opportunity to gain valuable exposure in the 7s rugby environment.

Building community capacity for change requires that we develop stronger human and social societies, and create the opportunities for growth.

He showed early signs of brilliance as soon as he touched the ball and started in the under-11 side that he captained for 2 years in a row. In 2017 he got his first taste of under-13 rugby as the youngest member of the under-13 7s team of Klapmuts Primary. He lead his team to a famous victory, won the Cup and was crowned the Player of the Tournament by a panel of National 7s players, along with Cornal Hendricks.

After a successful tournament, Brendon was invited to play trails for the Boland under-13 7s team, where he impressed and represented Klapmuts as a member of the Boland 7s side that played in the under-13 National 7s tournament in Free State, Bloemfontein.

Brendon finished primary school at the end of 2018 and got an opportunity to attend Waterkloof High School in Pretoria. He took part in athletics in the beginning of 2019 and quickly became a Waterkloof favorite. He literally ran himself into fame as he was crowned the Waterkloof Junior Sportsman of the year.
