



MUÑOZ ROLLS TO COURSE-RECORD 60

Sebastian Muñoz blazed across TPC Craig Ranch in round one of the AT&T Byron Nelson, setting a course-record 12-under 60 and becoming the first player in PGA Tour history to score two rounds of 60 or better in the same season. He posted a

60 at the RSM Classic last fall. His adeptness on the greens came courtesy of a PLD Milled Anser putter. The Colombian, who earned a T3 in Texas, was pin sharp with his i210 irons, too. He was #1 in greens in regulation, hitting 61 of 72, 84.72%.

Recently added to his bag, a PLD Milled Anser was instrumental in helping Sebastian Muñoz on his torrid, record-setting 60 in the first round, gaining more than four strokes with the putter.

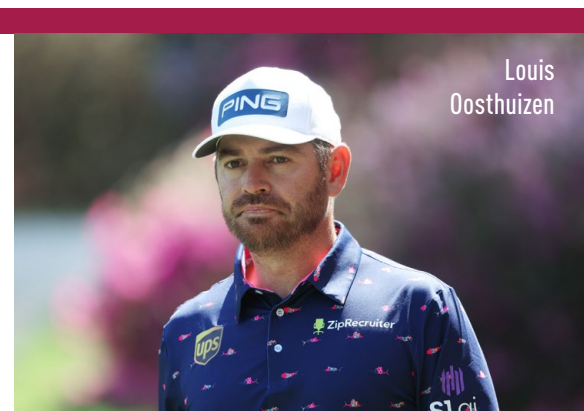

State Cowboys (he still lives near campus). The world #6 has a win (plus an unofficial victory) among four top 10s this season.

He's hardly alone in having a strong season. Corey Connors and Cameron Champ were top 10 at the Masters, Connors was third at the Dell Technologies Match Play, and Champ was T6 in Mexico, where Tony Finau was runner up. With his G425 LST, Champ leads the tour in average driving distance at 323.8 yards.

Joaquín Niemann won at Riviera, Sebastian Muñoz picked up his third top 4 this season at the AT&T Byron Nelson, and rookie Mito Pereira, with a third place among his results, qualified for his first PGA. Louis Oosthuizen, T2 at last year's PGA, is in the field. See the full list at left.
