Adrian Meronk has done his country proud again. In 2019 he became the first Pole to win a European Tour group event with a victory on the European Challenge Tour, later becoming the first Polish player to earn a card on the DP World Tour. This season he's been excelling, earning three top-3s among his six top 10s.
