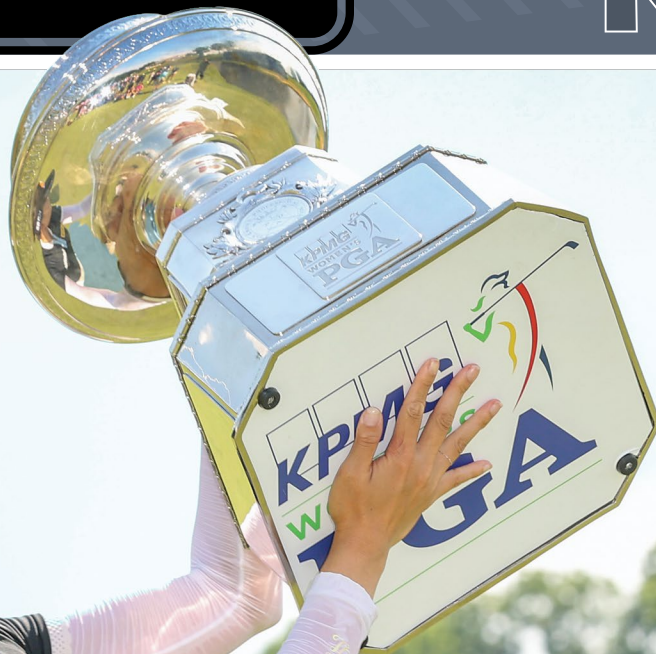

In Gee Chun's 64 on Thursday was a course record.



In the heat of major-championship pressure late on Sunday at the KPMG Women's PGA Championship, In Gee Chun kept her cool, her birdie on 16 the difference maker as she claimed her third major at Congressional Country Club in Bethesda, Md.

The 27-year-old Korean won the U.S. Women's Open in 2015 and added the Evian Championship in France the following year.

PING pros have won two of three majors on the LPGA Tour this season; Jennifer Kupcho lifted the Chevron Championship trophy in April.

MAJOR LIFT

ON LPGA, THAT'S 3 STRAIGHT TITLES

In Gee Chun's return to major glory Sunday was the third straight title and fifth overall on the women's circuit for PING this season.

The previous Sunday, Jennifer Kupcho's second title of the year saw her edge PING Pro Leona Maguire in a playoff at

the Meijer LPGA Classic. (Maguire won her first at the LPGA Drive-On Championship.)

A week earlier in a playoff between PING pros, Brooke Henderson won the ShopRite LPGA Classic, her 11th career victory, over Lindsey Weaver-Wright.

Sahith Theegala's confident, attacking style has garnered boisterous fan support during his rookie campaign on the PGA Tour, and his popularity will only grow after his best finish on Sunday, a T2 at the Travelers Championship. His world ranking certainly grew, from 120th to 66th, following his fifth top 10 this season. Only three weeks earlier he was T5 at the Memorial, and he had a T3 at the WM Phoenix Open. The 24-year-old Californian has pocketed more than \$2.4 million this season.

KOREA'S WINNING WAYS

Min Ji Park tallied her third win of the season on the Korea LPGA Tour, her second in three weeks, as she prevailed in a playoff over PING Pro Ji Young Park at the BC Card Hankyung Ladies Cup.

Of the 12 KLPGA tournaments this season, PING pros have won five, and PING clubs contributed to a sixth victory.

Only since April, PING pros have earned eight titles in Korea between the women's and men's tours. On the men's side, Bio Kim has won twice, and Junseok Lee once.
